The Death Penalty

- Unacceptable, however grave the crime of the convicted person.
- An offence to the inviolability of life and to the dignity of the human person
- Contradicts God's plan for individuals and society.
- It does not render justice to victims, but instead fosters vengeance.
- The commandment "Thou shalt not kill" has absolute value and applies both to the innocent and to the guilty
